

Wow, you are in for a ride with this one! The perfect blend of sci-fi and mystery, *The Babel Apocalypse* follows the narrator, Emyr, and dives deep into a future world that will leave you thinking.

There's two things I really appreciated about this novel. The first, is that it utilizes first person POV in the sci-fi genre. I prefer to read first person for the immersive experience and feel like sci-fi tends to be third person a lot of times. There was something powerful about being able to experience this world alongside Emyr. The second thing I really appreciate is that Vyvyan has a PhD in linguistics and that is evident in the plot of the story. It was so cool to see a professional background utilized in this way and because of this, we are able to get a unique perspective on language that we might not have if the author did not have such a deep level of knowledge.

Overall this was a good read with strong world building that felt immersive rather than info-dumping. It left me wondering what will happen next in this world and it is always scary and thought provoking with dystopian sci-fi to think about if our world could ever get this way.

I will say that the ending was very shocking/unexpected and crossed over into the psychological thriller/ horror genre for a bit. So unsettling, but also realistic given the world and the character's choices and
